ICO Seminar on Genetically Modified Coffee

London, 17 May 2005

- 1. The Executive Director presents his compliments and has the pleasure of inviting Members, Private Sector Consultative Board (PSCB) associations and observers to attend the ICO Seminar on Genetically Modified Coffee from 14.00 to 18.00 on Tuesday, 17 May 2005. The event will take place at the headquarters of the Organization at 22 Berners Street, London, during the week of the 93rd Session of the Council (information about these meetings has been circulated previously in document ED-1944/05). Simultaneous interpretation will be provided in English, French, Spanish and Portuguese.
- 2. The purpose of the Seminar is to review the current situation of genetically modified coffee, and to inform Members about developments in this area. The event will be chaired by Mr. Ezzedine Boutrif, Chief, Food Quality and Standards Service, at the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO). It will bring together representatives of research institutions, producing countries, scientists, Non-Governmental Organizations and other organizations interested in this field. A copy of the preliminary programme is attached.
- 3. The Executive Director wishes to recommend representation at the event by all ICO Member Governments, to ensure wide-ranging discussions and to generate conclusions and, if appropriate, recommendations for follow-up action.
- 4. The Seminar is free of charge to ICO Members, representatives of the PSCB associations and invited observers. For all other participants from interested institutions, there is a registration fee of £50 to help defray costs.
