Convocation of ICO meetings from 15 to 19 September in Cartagena, Colombia

The Executive Director presents his compliments and wishes to inform ICO Members and observers about the Seminar on Coffee and Health, the 89th Session of the International Coffee Council and other ICO meetings, which will take place at the Convention and Exhibition Centre in Cartagena, Colombia, from 15 to 19 September 2003, on the occasion of the 40th anniversary of the ICO.

Full information, including the programme, venue and other arrangements, is available in the Manual for Delegates prepared by the National Coffee Growers Federation of Colombia (FEDERACAFE) which will be circulated to all Members, and made available on the Websites of the ICO (www.ico.org) and the FEDERACAFE (www.cafedecolombia.com from 5 July).

I. Hotel reservations

Delegates are responsible for reserving their hotel accommodation, and are asked to indicate to the Aviatur agency how many rooms they may require by 30 June 2003 (see registration section below). This should subsequently be confirmed no later than 15 July 2003 by sending the attached hotel reservation form directly to Aviatur. It should be noted that there is considerable demand for hotel rooms in Cartagena at this time of the year. A list of hotels and rates is attached.

II. Travel

Delegates are advised to make their travel arrangements as soon as possible, as flights to and from Colombia can get very full at this time of the year. A number of airlines fly direct from Europe or the USA to Colombia, including Avianca, Air France, American Airlines, British Airways, Continental Airlines, Delta Airlines, Iberia and Varig.

Delegates attending meetings of the International Cocoa Organization (ICCO) in the Dominican Republic the preceding week may like to know that Copa Airlines (www.copaair.com) fly every day from Santo Domingo to Cartagena via Panama City (departing at 07.55 on flight CM110, transferring in Panama City to flight CM415, and arriving at 13.45 in Cartagena).

III. Tour of coffee-growing areas

FEDERACAFE has arranged a tour of coffee-growing areas from 19 to 21 September, which will include a visit to CENICAFE (National Coffee Research Centre), a typical lunch on a coffee farm, and a visit to the National Coffee Park (see registration form for more details). The cost of the tour, which includes domestic flights, hotels, food and transport is being subsidized by the FEDERACAFE and a small fee of US\$200 is payable by delegates. Delegates participating in the tour should note that when making their travel reservations to Colombia, they only need to book a single ticket from Bogota to Cartagena, as the return journey to Bogota is included in the tour.

Credentials – these should also be sent to the Executive Director by **18 August 2003** as indicated in section VII below.

V. Visas and passports

Delegates are advised to check with their authorities whether they require a visa for entry into Colombia. We understand that visas are not required by nationals of the following countries, which are Members of the ICO or were Members under the 1994 Agreement: Austria, Belgium, Bolivia, Brazil, Costa Rica, Cyprus, Denmark, Dominican Republic, Ecuador,

El Salvador, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Guatemala, Honduras, Indonesia, Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Luxembourg, Mexico, Netherlands, Norway, Paraguay, Philippines, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, United Kingdom and Venezuela.

Passports must be valid for six months beyond the intended length of stay. Further information about visas and passport requirements is available on www.minrelext.gov.co (Servicios section).

Credentials should be issued in writing by a relevant Ministry or government agency of that country or by a representative of the Diplomatic Mission of the Member concerned either in the country where the seat of the Organization is located or where a session takes place. Faxed credentials may be accepted; however, Members are requested to provide original credentials after the session for record purposes.

The credentials of delegations will be examined by the Chairperson, with the assistance of the Secretariat, who will report to the Council. The List of Delegations will be based on credentials received from Members and responses received from observers.

VIII. Observers

Observers from non-member countries, international organizations and private sector associations wishing to attend the Seminar on Coffee and Health and Council sessions are requested to inform the Executive Director about this in writing by **18 August 2003**.

IX. Badges

Badges will be prepared for collection by participants at the Information desk in the Convention Centre and Exhibition. For the purposes of identification and security, all participants are requested to wear the badges issued to them during all meetings listed above.
