The International Coffee Agreement 2001 Procedures for accession

1. The Executive Director presents his compliments and attaches information about procedures for accession to the International Coffee Agreement 2001¹ as follows:

Contracting Parties (Annex I)

2. Contracting Parties to the International Coffee Agreement 1994 or the International Coffee Agreement 1994 as extended – Annex I contains a list of these Contracting Parties which may accede by depositing an instrument of accession to the International Coffee Agreement 2001 by **30 September 2008**. A model of an instrument of accession is contained in Annex III.

Other Governments (Annex II)

3. Governments invited to the 82nd Session of the International Coffee Council at which the International Coffee Agreement 2001 was negotiated – Annex II contains the procedures for these Governments, which may accede by depositing an instrument of accession to the International Coffee Agreement 2001 by **30 September 2008**. A model of an instrument of accession is contained in Annex III.

4. All other Governments of any State member of the United Nations or of any of its specialized agencies may accede to the 2001 Agreement upon conditions which shall be established by the Council.

Model of an Instrument of Accession to the International Coffee Agreement 2001

WHEREAS the INTERNATIONAL COFFEE AGREEMENT 2001 (“the Agreement”) entered into force provisionally among Governments which have completed the formalities for the entry into force of the Agreement on 1 October 2001, in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (3) of Article 45 of the Agreement.

AND WHEREAS paragraph 1 of Resolution 404 of 28 September 2001, paragraph 2 of Resolution 410 of 24 May 2002, paragraph 2 of Resolution 412 of 30 September 2002, paragraph 2 of Resolution 414 of 21 May 2003, paragraph 2 of Resolution 418 of 20 May 2004, paragraph 2 of Resolution 421 of 18 May 2005, paragraph 2 of Resolution 423 of 22 May 2006, paragraph 2 of Resolution 426 of 25 May 2007 and paragraph 1 of Resolution 433 of 28 September 2007 establish conditions for accession by Contracting Parties to the International Coffee Agreement 1994 or the International Coffee Agreement 1994 as extended, and Governments invited to the session of the International Coffee Council at which the Agreement was negotiated which have not, prior to 25 September 2001 signed the Agreement;

NOW THEREFORE I, [NAME AND TITLE of the Head of State, Head of Government or Minister of Foreign Affairs], declare that the Government of [name of State], having considered the above mentioned conditions for accession to the International Coffee Agreement 2001, accedes thereto and undertakes faithfully to fulfil all its obligations under the Agreement.
