As at 5 May 2006, there were 74 Members of the Organization, comprising 44 exporting and 30 importing countries. Procedures for membership are contained in document ED-1800/01 Rev. 8. The Council will consider two draft Resolutions, one concerning the extension of the time limit until 31 May 2007 for the deposit of instruments of ratification, acceptance, approval or accession and another concerning the extension of the time limit to 31 May 2007 for the deposit of instruments by Governments which are provisionally applying the Agreement. The Executive Director will report on the current situation of membership and on contacts with non-member countries.
